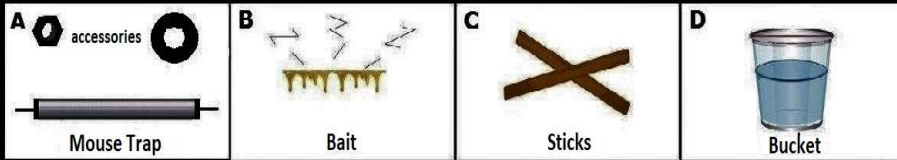


Mouse Trap Manual

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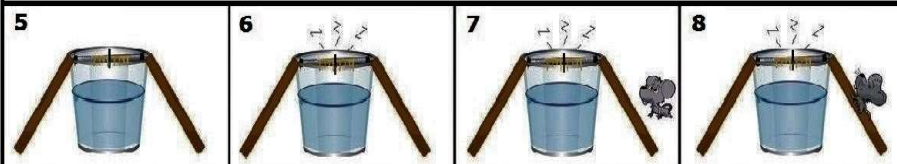


What you need before you start:

- A) Mouse trap: it includes the mouse stick and accessories; B) Bait: peanut butter or you favorite sweet and smelly bait (not included); C) Sticks: a pair of (wooden or any) stick to connect the stick (not included); D) Bucket: 5 gallon bucket full with water or sawdust (not included)



1) Drill two holes on both side of the bucket. 2) Place the ring in the middle of the mouse trap and then, attach the trap into the holes. 3) (optional) If the trap feels unsecured, you can screw the provided nuts to the sides and fix it to the bucket. Make sure the stick is loose enough to rotate freely. 4) Place the wooden sticks on the both side of the bucket so they lead the mouse to the mouse trap.



5) Put the bait in the middle of the trap, on and around the ring. 6) Place traps in areas of high activity. Typical active areas are along walls, behind appliances, behind objects, and darkened corners. Placing mouse traps out evenly at a set distance may provide thorough coverage, but it is not guaranteed to reach the mice. 7) When the mice smells the bait it will come to the bucket. 8) The mouse then will claim on the sticks.



9) Afterwards the mice will start walking on the rolling trap toward the bait. 10) When the mouse is fully on the trap it will start rotating. 11) After losing balance the mouse will drop in the bucket. 12) Depending on your choice of bucket filling, the mice will either drown (water) or just fall and stay alive (sawdust). The mouse can easily escape if there is no filling in the bucket.

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HOW TO INSTALL THE ROLLING MOUSE TRAP



1. Before you start, you need:
 - a. Your rolling mouse trap kit
 - b. One 5-gallon bucket
 - c. Two wooden planks / boards
2. Installation
 - a. Use gloves if you can. Mice can detect your smell on the trap and may shy away from it
 - b. Drill two holes on both sides of the bucket as shown below
 - c. Place the ring in the middle of the rolling mouse trap
 - d. Attach the trap into the holes by screwing the nuts and washers. Make sure the pipe trap freely
 - e. Place the wooden planks / boards on both sides of the bucket so mice can climb up



HOW TO USE THE ROLLING MOUSE TRAP

1. Smear the bait on the rolling mouse trap and on the ring (a teaspoon is enough). We recommend peanut butter. Mice eat primarily nuts & seeds
2. Fill the bucket with some water so mice cannot climb up
3. Place the bucket where the mice are – typically along walls and dark corners, behind appliances, etc. (not in the middle of open spaces)
